Northland schools showing reading level improvement



Almost 80% of our schools are showing improvement with students reading at grade level! This improvement is a result of our focus to improve student literacy. Results show an 8% increase in the number of students reading a grade level. June results are not available for Anzac Community School, Bill Woodward School, Fort McKay School and Father R. 2016-2017 Budget continues support for literacy and land-based learning

The Official Trustee for Northland School Division No.61 (NSD) approved the 2016-2017 budget at the Corporate Board Meeting held on June 24-25, 2016. The division's total operating budget is \$65, 909,404 and reflects NSD's efforts to implement recommendations in the Northland Inquiry Team Report.

"The budget maintains school staffing and helps educators strengthen First Nations, Métis language development with students," said Donna Barrett, Superintendent of Schools. "Resources have been allocated for land-based learning experiences and to support schools with weaving First Nations, Metis traditions into the curriculum."

This budget includes professional development to support schools with the division-wide Literacy Initiative and a commitment to implement actions outlined in the Attendance Improvement Initiative "Every Day Counts" Report.

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The division will be running at \$65,000 deficit and Barrett notes this budget does not include additional supports schools need such as learning coaches, mentorship programs and support for technology. Student enrolment for the 2016-2017 school year is projected to increase by 5%. See Board Attachments for more information http://nsd61.ca/download/80383 (page 26).

The power of Facebook headlines Communications Report

Facebook is a powerful communications vehicle for Northland School Division. Proof of this was part of the Communications Report presented by Communications Coordinator Curtis Walty. Walty highlighted specific posts to show the Official Trustee the level of engagement by school division stakeholders such as students, parents, staff, community members and education partners. For example, a recent Facebook post about Northland bursaries and scholarships was viewed by nearly 10,000 people! Repairs to Northland schools affected by wildfires near completion

David Cox, Division Facility Manager, updated the Official Trustee about Northland schools and teacher housing impacted by the Fort McMurray and area wildfires. On May 28th, the Official Trustee approved recommendations to close Anzac Community School, Bill Woodward School (Anzac), Father R. Perin School (Janvier) and Fort McKay School for the remainder of the 2015-2016 school year. In addition to school closures, our insurance adjustors recommended smoke damage repairs to 20 teacherages located in Anzac and Janvier. The required remediation's to schools are approximately 75% done, and will be completed with the next few weeks. Teacher housing has all been cleaned and the smoke sealing has been done.
